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#### 1. Overview of Operating Results, etc.

#### (1) Overview of Operating Results for the Fiscal Year Ended February 29, 2024

In the fiscal year ended February 29, 2024 (March 1, 2023 to February 29, 2024), the Japanese economy continued to recover at a moderate pace as socioeconomic activities gradually returned to normal propelled by the lifting of various COVID-related restrictions. However, soaring energy and raw materials prices owing to geopolitical tensions and rising domestic prices caused by foreign exchange rate fluctuations among other factors dampened consumer sentiment and corporate activities, rendering the economic outlook persistently uncertain.

Under these circumstances, at the Onward Group, improvement in the operation of OMO (Online Merges with Offline) stores offering "Click & Try" services and greater accuracy of the marketing measures using social media have boosted traffic to both physical and online stores, thus substantially contributing to overall sales growth. Operating profit margin also increased year-on-year due to the achievements of global business reforms and progress in streamlining the product supply chain. Thanks to these factors, the Group achieved higher sales, along with significant increases in all profit categories, year-on-year. Operating profit reached a record high for the first time since the fiscal year ended February 28, 2009.

As a result of the above, in the fiscal year ended February 29, 2024, consolidated net sales came to 189,629 million yen (+7.7% year-on-year), consolidated operating profit was 11,260 million yen (+115.9% year-on-year), consolidated recurring profit was 10,126 million yen (+90.4% year-on-year), and profit attributable to owners of parent was 6,611 million yen (+116.0% year-on-year).

The Onward Group is accelerating growth by reinforcing and expanding its business base through the development of new businesses and M&As. In doing so, the Group has adopted EBITDA (operating profit + depreciation and amortization) as a key performance indicator to facilitate earnings comparisons between companies regardless of differences in accounting standards.

In the fiscal year ended February 29, 2024, EBITDA amounted to 16,052 million yen (+54.7% year-on-year).

Results by segment were as follows.

#### [Apparel Business]

In Japan, sales grew thanks to the strong performance of "Nijyusanku" and other mainstay brands of the core operating company Onward Kashiyama Co., Ltd. The development and launch of popular products in "UNFILO" also contributed to substantial sales growth. At Onward Personal Style Co., Ltd., which operates the "KASHIYAMA" brand, sales at directly managed stores and B2B sales were robust as advertising efforts had a marked effect.

Overseas, sales increased in Europe, America, and Asia, with the profitability sharply improving. As a result, the Apparel Business posted higher sales and profit.

#### [Lifestyle Business]

Chacott Co., Ltd., which runs the wellness business, posted higher sales owing to enhanced marketing strategies utilizing social media and the development and launch of popular products in the Chacott Cosmetics line. At Creative Yoko Co., Ltd., a subsidiary engaged in a pet and home life business, sales remained favorable backed by the success of aggressive store opening measures. Performance at Yamato Co., Ltd., which operates a gift catalog business, also held firm.

As a result, sales and profit increased in the Lifestyle Business.

#### (2) Overview of Financial Position for the Fiscal Year under Review

Total assets on a consolidated basis as of the end of the fiscal year under review increased by 12,163 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year to 171,362 million yen. This was primarily due to increases in notes and accounts receivable—trade, and contract assets of 1,952 million yen, merchandise and finished goods of 7,959 million yen, and retirement benefit asset of 2,333 million yen.

Liabilities increased by 12,242 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year to 86,367 million yen. This was primarily due to increases in short-term borrowings of 5,318 million yen and long-term borrowings of 3,598 million yen.

Net assets decreased by 78 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year to 84,995 million yen. This was primarily due to profit attributable to owners of parent of 6,611 million yen, dividends of surplus of 1,628 million yen, a decrease in foreign currency translation adjustment of 990 million yen, an increase in remeasurements of defined benefit plans of 1,265 million yen, and a decrease in non-controlling interests of 5,121 million yen.

As a result, the shareholders' equity ratio was 46.6%.

#### (3) Overview of Cash Flows for the Fiscal Year under Review

1) Status of cash flows as of the end of the fiscal year under review

Cash flows provided by operating activities amounted to 3,999 million yen (an inflow of 5,685 million yen for the previous fiscal year) mainly due to a profit before income taxes, an impairment loss, an increase in trade receivables, and an increase in inventories.

Cash flows used in investing activities amounted to 4,321 million yen (an inflow of 4,390 million yen for the previous fiscal year) mainly due to purchase of property, plant and equipment, and purchase of investment securities.

Cash flows provided by financing activities amounted to 263 million yen (an outflow of 11,955 million yen for the previous fiscal year), which primarily included a net increase (decrease) in short-term borrowings and proceeds from long-term borrowings.

As a result, cash and cash equivalents at the end of the fiscal year under review increased by 337 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year to 14,133 million yen.

### (4) Basic Policy on Shareholder Returns and Dividends for the Fiscal Year under Review and the Next Fiscal Year

The Company positions returning profits to its shareholders as one of the most important management measures. Its basic policy is to provide stable and appropriate shareholder returns linked to performance, with a target dividend payout ratio of 40% or more, raised from previous 35% or more.

With regard to dividends for the fiscal year under review, the Company plans to pay out a dividend of 20 yen per share. For the next fiscal year, the Company plans to raise the annual dividend forecast per share by 4 yen from the previous year to 24 yen.

The Company will flexibly utilize its internal reserve for strategic investments in the establishment of a robust business structure, enhancement of financial constitution, and other efforts while giving consideration to balancing its needs for funds.

#### 2. Basic Policy on Selection of Accounting Standards

In consideration of comparability between each reporting period of Consolidated Financial Statements and comparability between companies, the Group plans to prepare its Consolidated Financial Statements using the Japanese GAAP for the time being.

The Group plans to appropriately handle the adoption of IFRS (International Financial Reporting Standards) in consideration of various circumstances in Japan and overseas.

In order to prepare for probable future losses on collection, estimated amount uncollectible is provided for in accordance with the historical average charge-off ratio in the case of ordinary receivables. In the case of certain accounts designated as highly doubtful accounts, a specific allowance is provided for based on individual detailed credit analysis.

#### 2) Provision for bonuses

Provision for bonuses is recognized for the estimated amount to provide for payment of bonuses to employees.

#### 3) Provision for bonuses for directors

The Company and certain of its domestic consolidated subsidiaries recognize provision for bonuses for directors in an estimated amount to provide for payment of bonuses to their directors.

#### 4) Provision for retirement benefits for directors and corporate auditors

Actuarial differences are accounted for as expenses over a certain number of years within the average remaining years of service of the employees at the time of occurrence during each fiscal year (5 to 10 years) using the straight-line method, commencing with the fiscal year following the one in which they were incurred.

Prior service costs are accounted for as expenses over a certain number of years within the average remaining years of service of the employees at the time of occurrence (5 to 10 years) using the straight-line method.

#### (5) Accounting policy for significant revenue and expenses

The main content of performance obligations and normal time when the performance obligations are satisfied (normal time when revenue is recognized) in core businesses related to revenue from contracts with customers of the Company and its consolidated subsidiaries are as follows.

#### 1) Revenue related to wholesale sales

Revenue related to wholesale sales identifies the delivery and shipment of products as performance obligations. In wholesale sales, the performance obligation is satisfied when the inspection by the customer is complete, but as there is no material difference between this and when the product ships, revenue is recognized when the product ships. Furthermore, the consideration for transactions is generally received within approximately three months from the time when performance obligations are satisfied and does not include a significant financing component.

#### 2) Revenue related to retail sales

Revenue related to retail sales identifies the delivery of products as a performance obligation. In retail sales, the performance obligation is normally satisfied when a product is delivered, so revenue is recognized when the product is delivered. Furthermore, the consideration for transactions is generally received within approximately one month from the time when performance obligations are satisfied and does not include a significant financing component.

#### 3) Revenue related to service provision

Revenue related to the provision of services primarily includes royalties received for granting licenses, and these grants are identified as performance obligations. These are either sales or usage-based royalties, measured using the counterparty's sales, etc. as the calculation basis, and revenue is recognized when the license is used or when the performance obligation allocated to sales or usage-based royalties is satisfied, whichever is later. Furthermore, the consideration for transactions is generally received within approximately three months from the time when performance obligations are satisfied and does not include a significant financing component.

#### (6) Accounting policy for hedging

#### 1) Accounting policy for hedging

Deferred hedging is applied. However, appropriation procedures are applied to trade payables and trade receivables denominated in foreign currencies with forward exchange contracts.

#### 2) Hedging instruments and hedge items

The derivatives designated as hedging instruments are principally forward exchange contracts. The related hedged items are trade payables and trade receivables denominated in foreign currencies and scheduled transactions.

#### 3) Hedging policy

For the purpose of fixing cash flows denominated in Japanese yen from payables and receivables denominated in foreign currencies by avoiding the risk of future foreign currency exchange rate fluctuation in relation to export and import transactions denominated in foreign currencies, the Company enters into forward exchange contracts based on settlement dates in response to orders received from and sent to business partners.

#### 4) Evaluation of hedge effectiveness

By setting up forward exchange contracts denominated in the same currencies with the same amounts and the same due dates to the amounts of orders received and sent denominated in foreign currencies, the Company ensures that the correlation from fluctuations in foreign currency exchange rates after entering into forward exchange contracts is maintained.

#### (7) Accounting policy for goodwill

Goodwill is evaluated on an individual basis and amortized on a straight-line basis over a reasonable number of years within 20 years.

#### (8) Scope of cash and cash equivalents in Consolidated Statements of Cash Flows

Funds (cash and cash equivalents) in the Consolidated Statements of Cash Flows are composed of cash on hand, bank deposits that can be withdrawn on demand, and short-term investments, which are highly liquid and readily convertible into cash, with an original maturity of 3 months or less and insignificant risk of changes in value.

#### (Changes in the presentation method)

(Consolidated Statements of Income)

"Commission expenses" under "Non-operating expenses" presented separately in the previous fiscal year, is included in "Other" as of the fiscal year under review, since it was no more than 10% of total non-operating

expenses. To reflect this change in presentation, the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year have been reclassified.

As a result, the 186 million yen that was presented in "Commission expenses" and the 632 million yen in "Other" under "Non-operating expenses" in the Consolidated Statements of Income for the previous fiscal year have been reclassified as "Other" of 819 million yen.

#### (Consolidated Statements of Cash Flows)

"Repayments to non-controlling shareholders" included in "Other" under "Cash flows from financing activities" in the previous fiscal year, is presented separately as of the fiscal year under review, since it has become more significant. To reflect this change in presentation, the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year have been reclassified.

As a result, the (1,229) million yen that was presented in "Other" under "Cash flows from financing activities" in the Consolidated Statements of Cash Flows for the previous fiscal year has been reclassified as "Repayments to non-controlling shareholders" of (190) million yen and "Other" of (1,038) million yen.
